

(This story should be read with a kind of vaudevillian style of humor in mind.)

(Beauregard Dale has been renting a farm from a local landowner, and allowing a man by the name of David Paragon to rent a room on that farm. The landowner has notified Beauregard that he wants his farm back, and that he needs to clear out his things. Here, we see Beauregard Dale on his way to tell David Paragon that he has to move out.)

(Both actors turn and face audience)

Beauregard: Well, you look fine to me.

David rolls eyes and both actors walk out of sight of audience)

Reporter: David Paragon refuses to leave rental property, and it costs him his life!

Reporter: Beauregard Dale, the unmarried Barber from Harrison Country, Illinois, who killed David Paragon, is on the move and authorities are hunting for him!

Reporter: It is thought that Beauregard Dale has fled Illinois and is somewhere in Indiana! UPDATE!
Beauregard Dale turns himself in to the Boone County Sheriff!

Beauregard: (Re-enters and faces audience)

Reporter: (Holding an ear of corn up to Beauregard's mouth like a microphone) Mr. Dale! Why did you shoot Mr. Paragon dead?

Beauregard: (Loving the attention) I'm not really into negotiation. Plus, I didn't mean to kill him. Some guys just can't hold their bullets.

Reporter: (Holding an ear of corn up to Beauregard's mouth like a microphone) Mr. Dale! Why did you turn yourself in?

Beauregard: (Proud of himself) I like to think I'm a good guy. Also, I ran out of money, and I hear the Boone County jail has good food. (Actor steps out of sight of audience)

(Beauregard Dale was sentenced to 30 years, but escaped after only a year in custody. It is not known for sure where he ended up, although some say he changed his name and opened a barber shop in Ft. Wayne called Much Hairdo About Nothing.)
